Accommodations: Koro Sun resort



Our lodging for the week will be provided by the Koro Sun Resort, situated on a private lagoon on the stunningly gorgeous coast of Vanua Levu. Your reservation includes meals at the resort's two restaurants, masterfully prepared using locally sourced ingredients, access to the Koro Sun's spa and golf course, and more. The family-friendly resort features a kids club, which includes a nanny service for children three years and younger and supervised recreational activities for youth up to age 12.

Our travel package offers two options for luxurious accommodations: a floating waterfront *bure* (adults-only) or a secluded garden *bure*.

Diving

Guests can explore the breathtaking coral reefs of the Namena Marine Reserve and Somosomo Straits. The Koro Sun Resort has a full-service dive shop offering three dives per day for certified divers, as well as a variety of certification courses. See korosunresort.com for more details.



Seacology projects

Our expedition will visit two Seacology project sites, Nukubalavu and Nabubu. At both locations, Seacology has funded schools for local children and helped to protect gorgeous and ecologically important Fijian habitat.

Our work in picturesque Nukubalavu goes back to 2007, when we funded a building to serve as the village's kindergarten and preschool in exchange for the establishment of a 25,600-acre marine reserve. Nine years later,

the school and many other buildings in the village were heavily damaged by Cyclone Winston, the strongest storm ever recorded in the southern hemisphere. Upholding our commitment to our partnership with the village, Seacology funded the repair and expansion of the school in 2017. It reopened after serving as a temporary shelter for a family rendered homeless by the storm.





Nabubu

Our latest project in Fiji is in the village of Nabubu, on the north coast of Vanua Levu. The community is protecting pristine rainforest and a marine area that includes part of Fiji's Great Sea Reef, the third-longest barrier reef in the world. Seacology is funding the renovations of the school and teachers' quarters and water storage tanks. Our expedition will attend a traditional ceremony hosted by village leaders.








Koro Sun Resort
