Mission

Seacology protects threatened habitats on the world's islands. We work directly with island communities to help them conserve their natural resources and improve their quality of life.

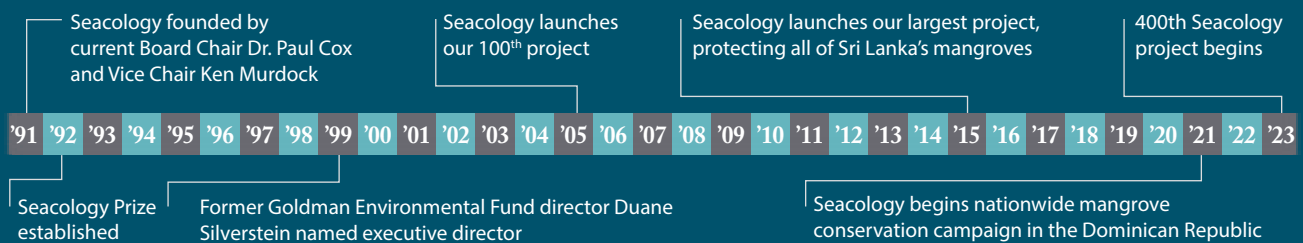
Approach

Seacology provides a tangible benefit to a community, such as a new school or clinic, in exchange for the community's support in establishing or enforcing a marine or forest reserve. Since 1991, Seacology has launched more than 400 projects on islands in 68 countries. These projects are protecting approximately 1.4 million acres of some of the world's most vulnerable ecosystems.

Why islands?

Many islands are home to species that live nowhere else in the world — so if one of these species is wiped out on its home island, it's lost to the world. In fact, island species account for roughly 80% of all recorded extinctions in the past 400 years.

Finances

In 2022, 72% of Seacology's support came from individual donors, with the rest from foundations, corporations, and Seacology affiliates.

Of our \$2.7 million in total expenditures, 80% went to program costs.
